**RESOLUTION
VILLAGE OF MAYBEE**

WHEREAS , it is to the advantage and benefit of the people of the Village of Maybee to promote business and industrial development and to improve the general economic condition of the Village of Maybee; and

WHEREAS , the owner of the land described in this Resolution has requested that the land described in this Resolution be annexed to the Village of Maybee; and

WHEREAS , the parcel numbers of the land in question are: 58-06-032-001-00; 58-06-029-019-00; 58-06-029-020-00; 58-06-029-018-00; 58-06-029-022-00; 58-06-029-021-00; 58-06-028-014-00; 58-06-028-010.00; 58-06-029-005-00; 58-06-029-004-00 and the metes and bounds description of the land is attached to and made a part of this Resolution and marked as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS , the land is immediately adjacent to the Village limits and its presence and use have an effect on the residents of the Village of Maybee to a greater degree than on the residents of Exeter Township as a whole; and

WHEREAS , the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) has projected a population increase for the Village of Maybee by the year 2040 at 30.6 percent and a population decrease for Exeter Township by the year 2040 of 7.3 percent; and

WHEREAS , the proposed annexation will provide additional tax base for Village of Maybee and will maintain the tax base for Exeter Township; and

WHEREAS , at such time as the current use of the land proposed to be annexed is completed the reclaimed property will become a logical and natural extension of the Village which is presently served by water and sewer; and

WHEREAS, the proposed annexation would be to the mutual benefit and advantage the Village of Maybee and of the owner of the land.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Village Council of the Village of Maybee as follows:

1. That the Village Council of the Village of Maybee, Monroe County, Michigan petitions the Board of Commissioners of the County of Monroe to annex to the Village of Maybee the property described as Exhibit A attached to this Resolution;
2. That the President and Clerk of the Village of Maybee are authorized to sign a petition directed to the Board of Commissioners of Monroe County and to attach a copy of this Resolution to the Petition, said Petition requesting that the Board of Commissioners hold a hearing and take action on the Petition as prayed for in the Petition.
