Council Corner

At the March council meeting the council received a report on the Capital Conference in Lansing that President Gaylor attended. He explained how the operation of the local governments are now changing to more internet reporting and less paperwork through the mail. A lot of the work will require more training because if not implemented as required the money from Lansing will not be processed and sent to the local governments.

Also reported on was the real breakdown of proposal one that will be on the ballot in May. The simple breakdown of the proposal is that the sales tax will no longer be on gasoline which is money that goes to the general fund. To make up for this loss of revenue the state is proposing a one percent increase on the sales tax. The new amount would not be collected on food or gasoline. The gasoline tax would be re-calculated and the money collected on gasoline would be used for road related items .

The other item discussed was the report on the bore samples taken on Maybee Scofield road showing that the base structure was very sound and suitable for milling and paving. The main question to resolve now is how much it will cost .
