Council Corner

The main topic of discussion at last night's council meeting was the railroad crossing at Main Street. The crossing is the most hazardous one in the village because of the angle and blind spots. The state would require that crossing lights and gates be installed to maintain the crossing. The cost for the maintenance of this equipment would be the responsibility of the village. Since the village already has a crossing a short distance away, the council adopted a resolution to permanently close the crossing. Instead of the village paying to maintain the crossing, it would be compensated by the federal government to close the crossing. This money would have to be used for road improvements.

Plans are moving along on the reconstruction of Maybee-Scotfield road and the project should be started within the next 60 days. Also approved was the crack sealing of Bluebush Road and Raisin Street by an outside firm. Local streets will be handled by the village.
