Since April the new slide and merry-go-round have been installed at the park and the rocket ship has been repaired. The two new concrete dugouts have been build and painted at the Stoneco ballfield and with the blue color they sure stand out. Also at the park with the help of Woodchuck Tree Service 64 cottonwood trees that were growing in the creek on the North side of the park were taken down. They were then cut up and removed thanks to B.M.F. Welding. George Miller Excavating then came in to clear out the area so we could get to the stumps. Finally Stoneco sent over their very large excavator to remove all 64 stumps some of which were over two foot in diameter. Last weekend workers from the JAWS program (Jail Alternative Work Service) started setting posts for a new fence along the property line. We can only imagine how much it would cost to pay for the removal of that many trees, some over 100 feet tall, if we did not have local businesses to step up and do it as a community service.

For an up-date on the new building, all of the doors and windows have been replaced, the new floor in the back of the building is in, the divider walls are all roughed in, the cracks in the blocks have been repaired and the utilities have all been installed. We do not have a completion date yet but things are moving at a very fast pace.

Things that are still on the table are repairs to the culvert on Blazer road, curb repair (if we can find a company that will do it) crack sealing the rest of the roads and putting up all the new Christmas decorations. For a little town we sure have a lot going on. Our new slogan,
