Council Corner

The August council meeting discussed a wide range of items but the main item was the closure of Main Street at the RR crossing. When most people understand the reasoning behind it they accept the change. The state has been trying to close this intersection for the last 20 years due to safety concerns. The good news is that the inconvenience of going to the next crossing is only two blocks away. The amount of money that the federal and state government paid to the village to close this shortcut is enough to pay for half of the total rebuilding and widening of Maybee-Scofield road which is over a mile long. The Monroe water department should be complete with their extension of the line on Maybee-Scofield by the middle of September and that is when the road rebuild will start. The road will be pulverized and re-graded, widened to 11 foot lanes in each direction with a 2 foot paved shoulder on each side. It will start at Raisin Street and go all the way to Zink Road. The winter drive should be a little nicer this year. All of the road rebuilding in the village is contracted out by the village council and not the county or state. The funds for these projects come from the villages share of state gas tax revenues and in this case from funds received for the closure of the Main 'street crossing.
