At the March council meeting the property split on Raisin Street was approved and there are now 8 more build-able parcels of land in the Village of Maybee. Each lot is 190 foot wide by 280 foot deep.

Also discussed was the possibility of repaving Maybee Scofield Road from Raisin Street to Doty Road. The plan would be to mill off the existing road and widen the sides so the road would be 11 foot wide in each direction with a 2 foot paved shoulder on each side. Councilman Archer, Gramlich and Rogers walked the entire length of the road to see what would be required. The councilmen along with President Gaylor also filled in a lot of potholes while they were covering the route. It looked like the senior citizen road patrol.. Thanks for a job well done. If everything goes right it might be the last pothole patch on this road for a long time.
