Council Corner

At the March council meeting the council listened to a proposal from the Township Supervisor for the Village of Maybee to transfer ten thousand dollars to the township for road work outside of the village. This would amount to approx. \$20.00 per person living in the village. This request was turned down. Progress at the park is coming along at a rapid pace. The council approved replacing the Spinner at the park which finally wore out and also add a smaller slide for the younger kids.

The main item at the meeting was the decision by the council to purchase the building located next to the village hall and restore it to be a main part of the village. There is enough room in the building to house the village offices, a large meeting room and enough room in the back of the building to store all of the village equipment including the truck. Money for the purchase would come from the Capital Improvement Fund and much of the labor for the repairs would be supplied by the JAWS (jail alternative work service) personal. When completed the building would no longer be an eyesore for the people in the village. The front of the building should be in better shape by Maybee Day.
