

# Village Of Maybee Council Meeting

9/13/2023

President Joel Grubb opened the meeting at 7:30 pm with the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Roll Call:** President Grubb, Council Lieto, Archer, Iott, Liedel, Gramlich, Treasurer Grubb.  
Absent: Clerk Shaw and Councilman Shaw.

**Motion to Approve Agenda:** Gramlich 2<sup>nd</sup> Archer Carried.

**Motion to Approve August Minutes:** Gramlich, 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieto Carried.

**Motion to Approve Paying the Bills as Presented:** Liedel, 2<sup>nd</sup> Archer Carried.

**Motion to Approve Treasurer Report as Presented:** Gramlich 2<sup>nd</sup> Liedel Carried.

**Review & Approval of 2024-2025 Library Budget:** Motion Iott 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieto to approve the Village's portion of \$2,996.25 for the Maybee Library 2024-2025 Budget. Carried. \_

## **Old Business:**

- Sidewalk / Curbing Update: Barker will be starting the sidewalk on the West side of Raisin Street in the next 2 weeks.  
Desbrough Excavating said that MISSDIG is scheduled to come out on Friday and next week they will be pouring the concrete at corner of Bluebush and Blaser at the gas station.
- Garbage Pickup Inquiry: A Representative from Steven's Disposal was present and the Village has received a report from the company. Village is still waiting to receive a report from Fairway Refuse.
- Sanitary Sewer Repair Update: The pipe has been jetted out and measured for the liner. Project should begin in 2 weeks.
- Baldwin Road Update: Mannik & Smith has requested to meeting with Village Board and discuss possible grants and the scope of project. Workshop is set for Friday September 15<sup>th</sup> @ 11am.
- Brush Pile and Aggregate Pile Changes: Brush Pile has been moved to within the gated Village Lagoon area and will possibly have 2 controlled burns per year. Fencing in an area behind Village Hall to store donated aggregate from Stoneco per village needs.
- Resident Request Regarding Driveway Approach: Council agrees that the approach falls under existing Sidewalk Ordinance. Owner is responsible for cracking and repairs.
- Sesquicentennial / Beautification Updates: Schedule for the 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> weekend has been finished. Parade, bike decorating contest, helicopter rides, petting zoo, Village scavenger hunt, free bounce house and face painting and more on Saturday and Sunday. Music will be all day. Volunteers are still needed for the weekend. Runs from 10 – 5pm.

**New Business:**

- Box Grader Inquiry: Received the new tractor and could use a box grader for the ball diamonds and different areas around the village.

**Motion Gramlich 2<sup>nd</sup> Archer to get prices on a Box Grader. Carried.**

- Future JAWS Work Plans: Volunteers are still needed as overseers for weekend JAWS Crew work. Signup sheet is available at the Village Hall.
- Contracted Mowing for Baldwin Place: Village President met with Patriot Lawncare to discuss a mowing, trimming and some tree trimming Contract in Baldwin Place.

**Motion Iott 2<sup>nd</sup> Archer to have Patriot Lawncare to mow and trim the Cul-De-Sacs and to trim small trees when needed for \$130 per mowing cycle as needed. Carried.**

**Council Comments:**

- Councilman Lieto stated that Watt's Roofing had come out and looked at the roof over the Village Hall area. He stated he did not know if there were any repairs made.
- Councilman Gramlich stated that there are multiple trees on Fredricks Street that are hanging over the sidewalk and should be looked at for trimming.

**Public Comments:**

- Questions to the Steven's Disposal Representative regarding pricing and pickup service were asked.
